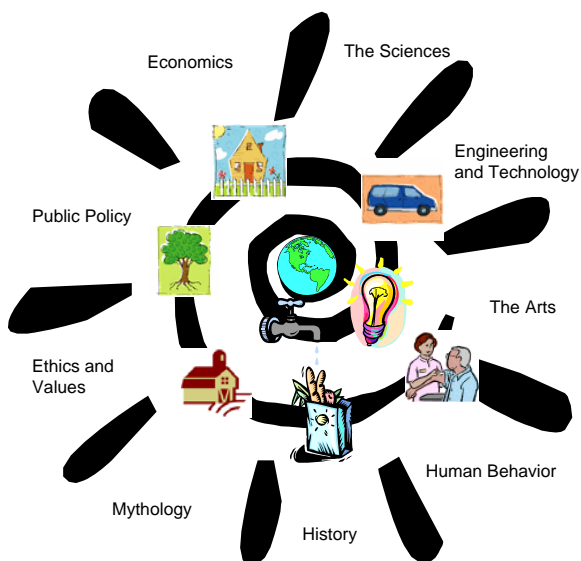


## Earth Sustainability
